Category A: KS1

Category B: KS2

Category C: KS3/4

All entries should be on A3 card, paper or board and can include: **collage, photography, paint, pencil or print**. You must submit your completed design/s in hard-copy.

A creative lesson plan is available for teachers to support the poster competition during PDL, ICT and/or Art class.

Winners will be announced by October 2009 and be presented with framed copies of their posters at the Hampshire Schools' Anti-Bullying Conference at Marwell Hotel on 16 October 2009.
